Skidån runs from Fageråsjön to Bodsjön which in turn flows into Revsundssjön. There is a path along Skidån where you as a visitor can get more knowledge about forestry in proximity to water.

When you follow the path you will be able to see various techniques, ideas and target images

- all with the making forestry more efficient both more effective and more gentle to our lakes and water courses as a starting point.

By managing forests with good environmental consideration, profitability and an understanding for the importance of forest products we can contribute to a sustainable society. To make clear what needs to be protected in woodland and how best to accomplish that there are target images for guidance.

Along the path we show you how various target images can be applied practically in forestry. How to cross a water course without causing damages, examples of non-clear-cutting forestry and how to treat environments that demands special considerations. Perhaps you as a forest owner can get inspiration and ideas.



Triple Lakes – project for healthier water

The path along Skidån has been created as a part of the project Triple Lakes - or Three Lakes - a cooperation project working towards healthier water environments and cleaner water around the lakes Locknesjön, Näkten and Revsundssjön. Within the project authorities and NGO's are cooperating towards a decreased environmental impact in and around the lakes. The projects overall goal has been to clean clear water and the biodiversity is to be maintained in the future. All three lakes are identified as Natura 2000 areas and the project has been financed by grants from the European Union via the LIFE-programme.

Natura 2000 is a network of identified areas with high natural values within the EU. The aim with the network is to protect species and habitats that are typical for the region they exist in, in Sweden and other countries.

The LIFE-programme is EU's financial tool for environmental and climate.

The programme's general aim is to contribute to implement, update and develop EU's climate policies and legislation with regards to the environment through financing projects with the aim improve the environment in the member countries. The overall purpose is to create a resource efficient and climate durable society, to stop the loss of biodiversity as well as support the management of Natura 2000 areas.
